Implementation of the CBSA Single Window Initiative (SWI)

The main purpose of the **Export** and **Import** of **Hazardous Waste** and **Hazardous Recyclable Material Regulations** (**EIHWHRMR**) is to protect Canada's environment and the health of Canadians from the risks posed by the transboundary movement of hazardous wastes and hazardous recyclable materials through exports from, transit through and imports into Canada and to implement Canada's international obligations.

Hazardous waste and hazardous recyclable material are substances that can be a potential risk to human and environmental health. Examples are residues from industrial operations, manufacturing processing plants and hospitals or obsolete materials such as waste lubricants and pesticides

Currently, with the exception of shipments transported by rail, all shipments of hazardous waste and hazardous recyclable material crossing the Canadian border must be accompanied by the following two documents:

- a. Permit (e.g., export, import, transit or Canada-to-Canada transit)
- **b.** Movement Document

Note regarding rail shipments: The movement document for rail shipments is replaced by a rail consist, provided that a rail consist contains the same information as movement document Under the Single Window Initiative, release requests will be submitted using a new Integrated Import Declaration (IID) that allows custom brokers to submit and obtain electronic release for goods also regulated by participating department and agencies.

Release requests for hazardous waste and hazardous recyclable material may be provided to the CBSA electronically by submitting an IID. The IID must include the following information:

- a. Movement Document Number
- **b.** Permit number (Notice number)
- c. Intended use code
- d. Generator and receiver information

Permit and movement document must accompany the shipments of hazardous waste and hazardous recyclable material and be presented to the border services officers, who will verify the content of paper permits and movement documents with the IID.

Shipments will be released only when all IID information is correct and complete, and border service officer, upon visual examination of the shipment, is satisfied that it complies with the import requirements. The border services officers will no longer:

- a. Collect the Movement Document and Permit with all applicable amendments
- b. Date-stamp the Movement Document and Permit with all applicable amendments
- c. Forward these documents to Environment and Climate Change Canada (ECCC)

Environment and Climate Change Canada will receive the IID information upon release of each shipment.

Note: Under SWI, information requirements will remain the same. There are no additional data requirements for the import process.

Data Element Rationales

The following data element rationales provide additional information of the specific data element requirements required under the Single Window Initiative

Intended Receiver per Part A of Movement Document (invoice level)	Information is used to track shipments of hazardous waste or recyclable material as Environment and Climate Change Canada (ECCC) must know where the shipment is destined and who is supposed to take ownership of it at destination. This information can be provided at the invoice level or commodity level.
Generator per Part A of Movement Document (invoice level)	Information is used to track shipments of hazardous waste or recyclable material as ECCC must know the origin of the shipment and who has ownership at the shipping site. This information can be provided at the invoice level or commodity level.
Intended Use Code	Not mandatory, but if a code is provided under base codes 050 and 160 , then that triggers that the goods/cargo are hazardous and therefore a notice number and movement document number must be provided.
Intended Receiver per Part A of Movement Document (commodity level)	Information is used to track shipments of hazardous waste or recyclable material as ECCC must know where the shipment is destined and who is supposed to take ownership of it at destination. This information can be provided at the invoice level or commodity level
Generator per Part A of Movement Document (commodity level)	Information is used to track shipments of hazardous waste or recyclable material as ECCC must know the origin of the shipment and who has ownership at the shipping site This information can be provided at the invoice level or commodity level.
ECCC Document Type	To import controlled substances, an importer must have a permit, movement document, allowance or allowance transfer and this element is required so the document type can be validated.
Document Reference Number	A permit, movement document, allowance or allowance transfer will have a unique number assigned and this enables validation of the permit and/or the shipment reported to ensure the document is valid and not expired.
